

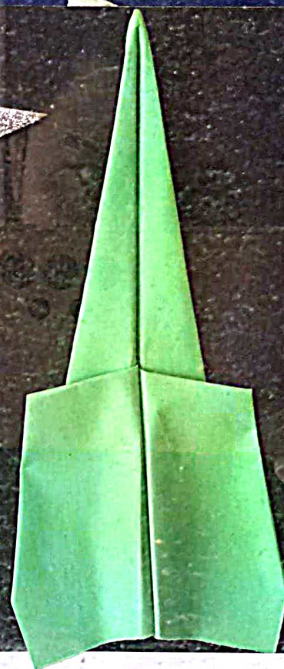

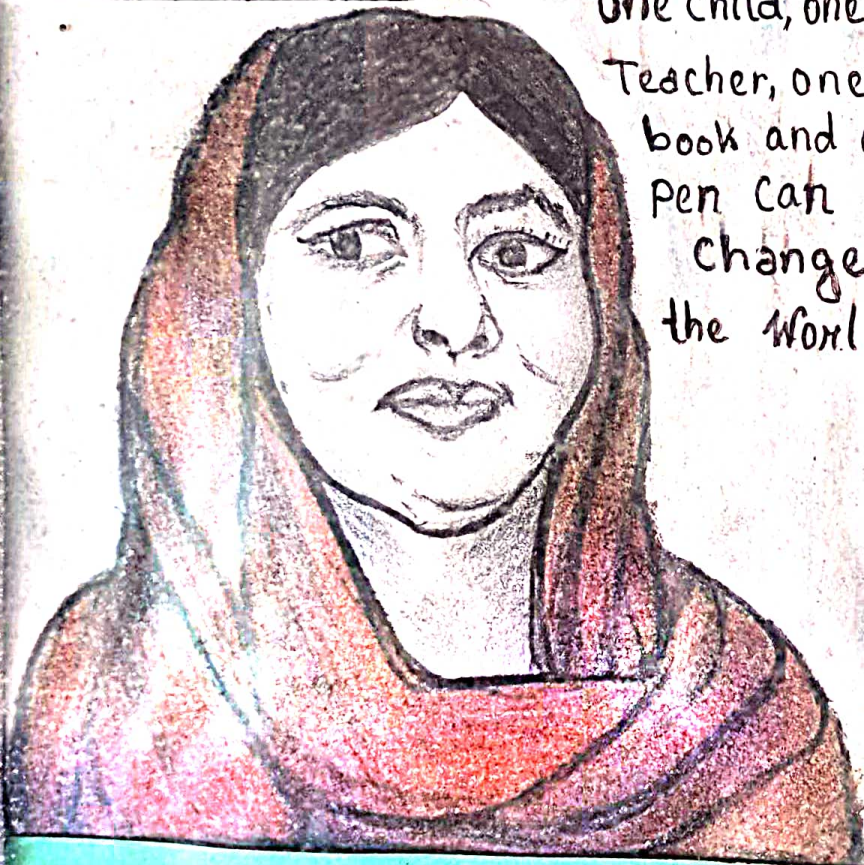


Pratibha

He was a constitutional head sharing corporate authority with his Council, general representatives of the leading clans within his territory. Tisot Sing declared war and fought against the British for attempts to take over control of the Khasi Hills.

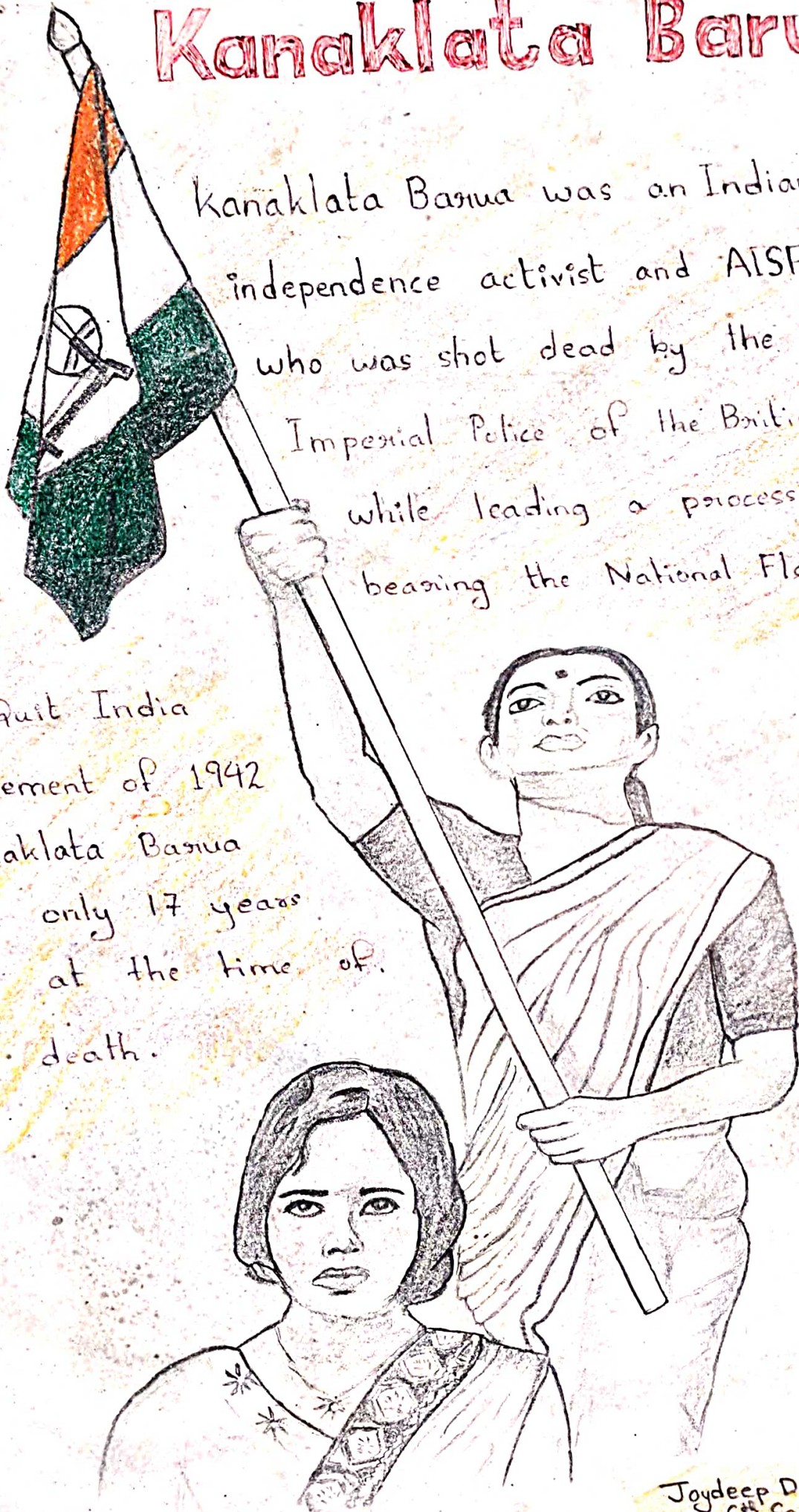

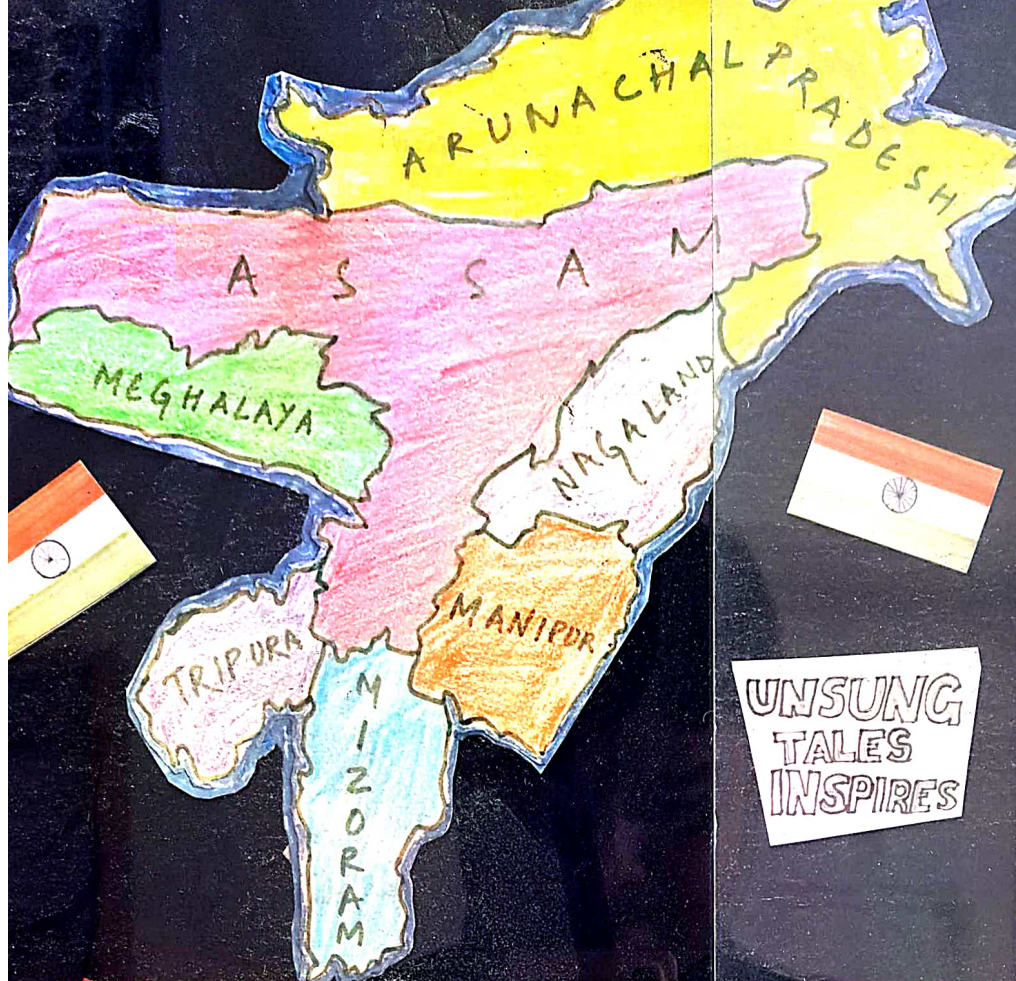

Rani Gaidinliu

“We are free people, the white men should not rule over us.” Said a 13-year old Rani Gaidinliu of the Rongmei Naga tribe in 1927, while issuing a clarion call to all ethnic Naga tribes from remote hills of the northeastern region. The same year, she joined the Hekha religious reform movement begun by her cousin Haipou Jadonang. She was arrested in 1932 at the age of 16, and sentenced to life imprisonment. Jawaharlal Nehru met her at Shillong jail in 1937, and gave her the title of Rani. Released in 1947 after India's independence, she continued to work for the upliftment of her people.



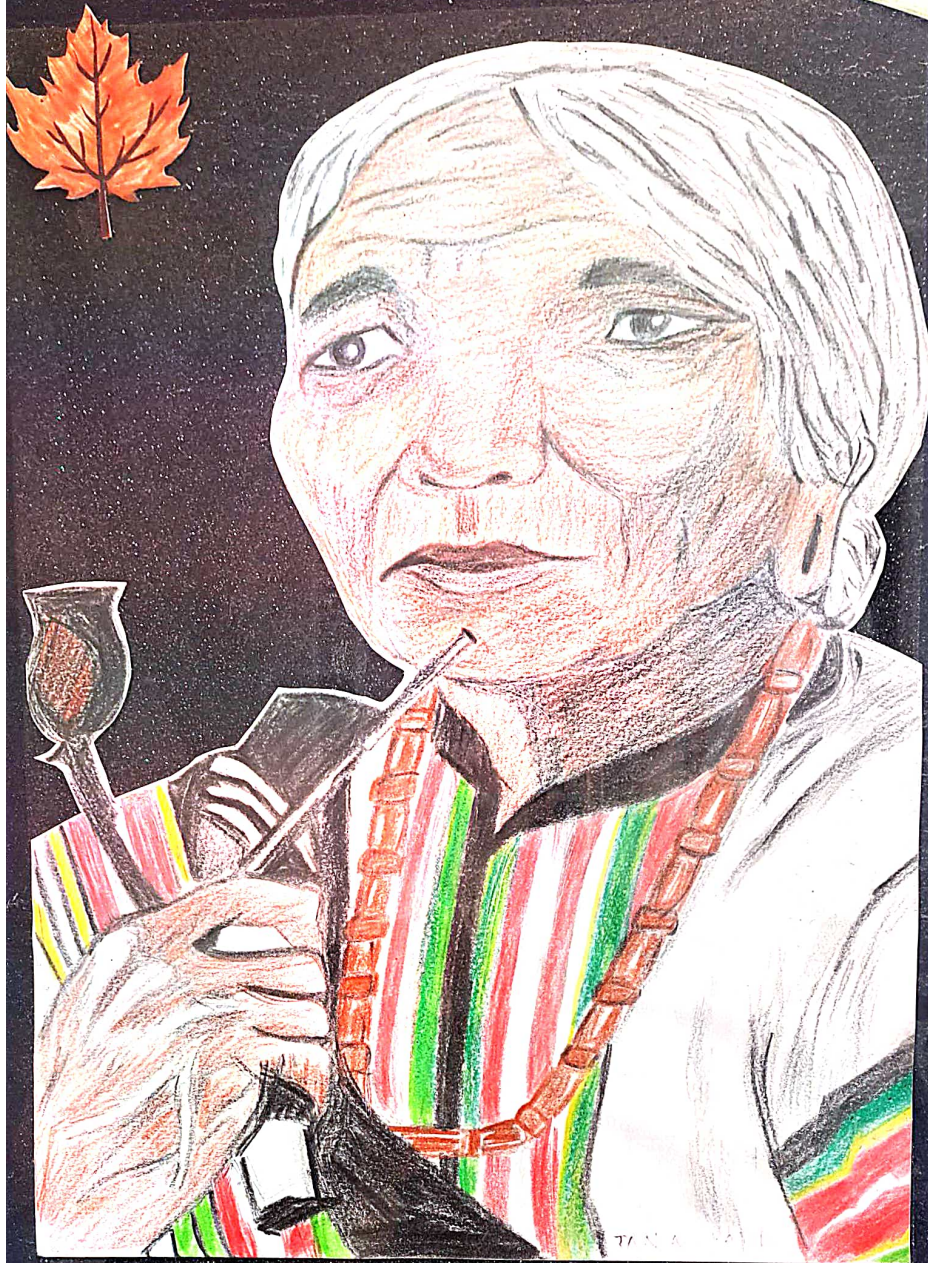

Jadonang Malangmei (1905-1931), popularly known as Haipou Jadonang, was a Naga spiritual leader and political activist from Manipur, British India. He established the religious movement.

LALNU ROPULIANI

After her Spouse Vandula passed away in the late 19th century, Ropuliiani became the first female chief in the history of Mizoram as is known today. She was the village leader of Denlung, a Southern Mizoram Community close to Thakthial.

Lalnu Ropuliiani symbolized bravery and selflessness during the Indian freedom struggle. She refused to recognize British colonial rule because she did not believe that the British Colonists were superior, and as a result, she was imprisoned by the imperialists in 1893.

Ropuliiani passed away in prison in January 1894.

known as the 'Iron Lady of Manipur' is an Indian Civil rights activist, political activist and a poet from Manipur. She began a hunger strike in favour



of achieving the abolition of Armed Forces (Special Powers) Act, 1958 that grants the Indian armed forces to search arrest people without warrant, if there is 'reasonable suspicion' that a person is acting against the state. She ended the fast on 9 August 2016 after 16 Years of long fasting, having refused food and water for over 500 weeks, she has been called the 'world's longest hunger strikes'. She was voted the 'top woman icon' of India by MSN Poll in 2014.
